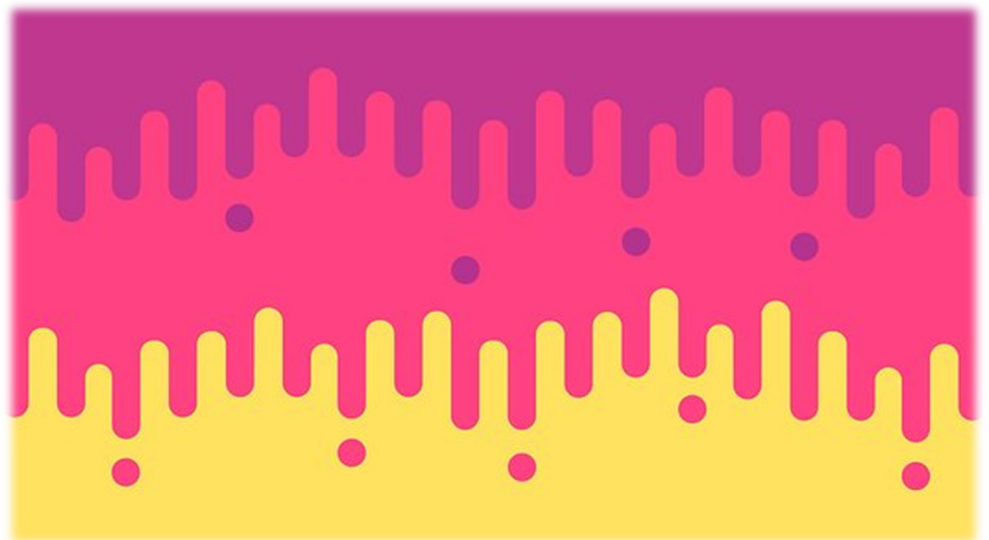

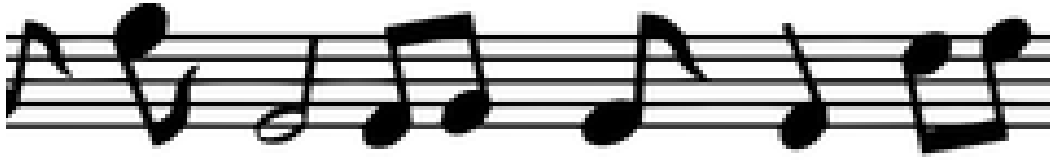

School children practice at the school with our new music teacher Frank Amador, and the other children practice with me after the 11:00 Mass in the Church. SCHOOL NEWS

Our 2021-2022 school year is off to a great start. With an enrollment of 240 students in our elementary school and 81 children in our preschool (2,-5 yr olds) the parish can be very proud of



a vibrant and faith-filled school community. We welcomed three new staff members this year; Daniel Cavar (PE, Athletic Director) Frank Amador (Performing Arts & STEM) and Michelle Langley (Kindergarten), who join our already amazing team. **Our school is Christ-centered** and celebrating Mass together with our parish is central to

our mission. This year our students will attend school Masses four times a month: two Masses at the church, one Mass outdoors on the school campus, and one parish live-streamed 8 AM Mass. Our first school Mass this year was on the Feast of our patron saint, St. Gregory the Great.

There is a lot of energy and excitement with the addition of a Performing Arts Program to our curriculum this year. Thanks to the generosity of our parents and the expertise of our new music teacher, all students K-8, have the opportunity to learn to play the keyboard, ukulele, and percussion instruments. The children's choir at school is almost thirty students strong and they are honored to sing monthly at our parish Mass.



Robotics and coding programs have started in middle school, and Next



Generation Science Standards are informing our science curriculum. The seventh graders are preparing to enter projects in the Greater San Diego Science & Engineering Fair and STEM class are integrated at all grade levels.

Building community is an essential part of school life. Our middle school students love their "Little Buddies". So far, they have had storytelling sessions, buddy up for Mass, with many more exciting activities to come. Servant leadership opportunities for students include Student Council, Flag Corps, Student Store Staff, Prayer Chain Ministry, and a Safety Patrol Ministry is currently in formation. After-school sports are in full swing with Girl's Volleyball, JV and Varsity Flag Football teams, and Cheer. We are so grateful to our parent volunteer coaches and look forward to a great season of Guardian sports.

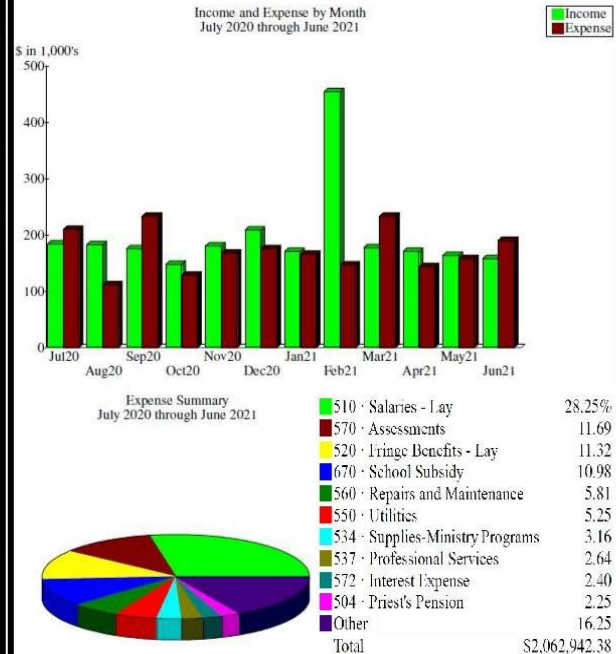

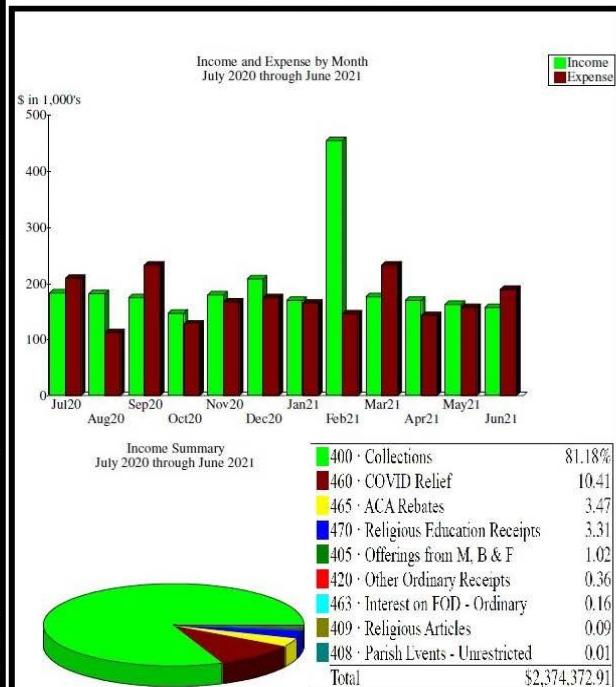
