



When I was a kid, a friend at church said, "If you get to Mass by the Gospel, it counts!" As a lifelong late-arriver, it's something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If the "it counts" is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale, then the Gospel reading today shows how insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light. How can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental?

The famous "Road to Emmaus" story reminds us that Jesus spends a significant period of time with two of his disciples who need the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus



alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. He connects the Hebrew scriptures with his own suffering, death, and resurrection. Later the disciples would report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire, and this led them to be able to discover Jesus' presence in the "breaking of the bread."

Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. That's precisely the point: **Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass.** Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we took even more seriously the fact that Jesus himself sets our hearts ablaze with his Word so that we too, can meet him in the Eucharist. Use any/all the ideas listed below to grow closer to God and each other during the Easter Season.

Pray-continue the ritual of praying with your family...just because lent has ended, it doesn't mean that you drop the good habits of prayer your family made. Prayer reminds us that God is the most important person and we must trust Him to lovingly guide us in all aspects of our lives.

Talk— continue to talk in meaningful ways and don't allow busy schedules to get in the way of family time. Dinner or bedtime rituals may include sharing moments of where we felt blessed by God in our day, or reading and discussing the upcoming Sunday readings.

Work-continue to work together doing acts of charity or service. Consider signing your family up for the 3rd Annual, "Million Meal Event", which is happening on June 8th and 9th. April is National Child Abuse Protection Month

Did you know...The Catholic Church is deeply committed to protecting children from abuse and holding people accountable for inflicting such pain? In December 2021, the revised Book VI of the Code of Canon Law went into effect. This is the most recent of several documents that specifically address the issue of the abuse of children. Other documents include Vos estis lux mundi and Vademecum. These documents expand the acts which are considered abusive, clarify the manner in which the cases are processed, and hold people accountable for their action or inaction with regard to processing of a case. Of significant importance is attention given to the care of victim survivors and all who have been harmed.

Bishops in the US lead the way for change, with implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People 20 years ago. Today every diocese and eparchy must have in place systems for tending to those who have been harmed, protecting those in our care and seeking restorative justice.
